

1 IMPROVE THE CAPACITY

OF CIVIL PROTECTION INSTITUTIONS BY EMPHASIZING COMMUNITY-BASED STRUCTURES.

- → **PROTECTION** setting up local protection committees
- → TRAINING: risk management, project management, environmental protection, and gender equality in times of emergency
- → **SUPPORT**: developing awarenessbuilding tools, risk maps, emergency plans, management tools, and vulnerability assessments
- → **COACHING:** preparatory, mitigation, soil conservation, and restoration projects



CECI developed its risk and disaster management expertise while working in this small Asian country regularly affected by climate shocks. With over \$610,000 in funding, we worked for nine months with ethnic minorities in the high plateaus of Vietnam to put an alert system in place to effectively reduce damages from flash flooding and the resulting landslides.

ALL PROJECTS

Haiti is among the most exposed countries to natural disasters. Disaster mitigation, humanitarian aid, and reconstruction projects are crucial and the ability to implement them, both in times of stability and crisis, is a gage of success. Eight of our interventions targeted long-term reduction of the country's vulnerability during recurring natural disasters. They improved people's ability to act with increased speed, efficiency and accuracy in emergency situations, and implemented reconstruction and rehabilitation projects. With nearly \$9 million in the last five years, we have been able to prevent damages, manage the harsh effects of natural disasters, carry out awarenessraising campaigns, hold simulation and training activities, provide supplies and life-saving equipment, and set up evacuation centres.
