THE L&L COLLECTIVE, CECI AND WUSC ARE PARTNERS FOR INTERCULTURAL EXCHANGE BETWEEN COFFEE PRODUCER COMMUNITIES AND CANADA.

Montreal, August 12, 2016— the *L&L Collective*, the *Centre for International Study and Cooperation (CECI)* and *World University Service of Canada (WUSC)* are pleased to announce the signing of an agreement as part of the *Uniterra* program. The organizations are teaming up to raise awareness among Canadians about supply, production, processing and marketing in the coffee industry as a means of supporting local socio-economic development that is inclusive of women and youth.

The L&L Collective is proud to announce its first ever artist-in-residence program, which it offers this year in cooperation with the Uniterra program. The program will provide two jury-selected artists with coaching over 15 days as they develop an art project in collaboration with a community of coffee producers. The artists, Frederic Bigras-Burrogano and Véronique Buist, have submitted proposals to work with members of the host community to develop project activities. The residency will take place from August 14 to 31, 2016, in a village near the city of Lamas, in Peru.

It is with great enthusiasm that President of the L&L Collective, Christian Lacroix, will accompany the artists on the trip and coordinate the project with support from the Uniterra program. He will also take part in training workshops with various actors from the coffee industry.

Upon their return to Canada, the artists will hold an exhibition to mark the end of their residency and to show their work to the public. Guests will get an exclusive glimpse into this unique experience shared between the artists and the members of the host community in Peru.
